The highlands around Santiago, at Central Chile, are especially cold during autumn and winter seasons. In the company of Shelly Jardine, we spent a whole day around Farellones and Valle Nevado, looking for some interesting birds. Despite this cold day, we got the chance to spot a good number of species and have a look to the Andes heart landscapes.

We left the hotel at 7:00 a.m. and drove to our first birding stop where we rapidly found some good species including Moustached Turca and Dusky-tailed Canastero, both Chilean endemic.

We stopped several times along the way, where we found a good selection of finches like, Mourning Sierra-Finch, Band-tailed Sierra-Finch, Grey-hooded Sierra-Finch and Rufous-collared Sparrow. We try to visit the Yerba Loca reserve but, unlucky for us, the road was closed because a big storm the week before.

We continued driving to the higher lands, with strong winds and even some snow, but we could find a couple of Magellanic Horned Owl resting on a tree branch. Around Farellones town we saw some highlands species like Rufous-banded Miner, Black-billed Shrike-Tyrant and Black-winged Ground Dove. We also had some great views of several Andean Condors and mountain caracaras and two species of falcons: aplomado and peregrine falcons.

We came back to the hotel at 6:30 p.m. after having seen 30 species of birds, nothing bad for a winter day at the Andes.
